A company of British soldiers, led by a deranged commander on the Western Front in France, await their fate as the Germany army prepares to attack. R. C. Sherriff famously drew on his own experiences in the trenches to write his 1928 play set on the tense eve of 1918's German Spring Offensive. That first-hand authenticity has kept the play alive for a century and it has been filmed several times, but not for many years. Tim Robey in The Telegraph says, "Wonderfully acted First World War drama goes deep into the trenches... the strength of the piece depends still on its confinement: the claustrophobia of the setting has an eerie, gaseous power".

This haunting adaptation of a short story by Anita Shreve tells the tale of Elisa, a mute woman who lives a quiet life working as a cleaner for a top-secret research facility. Her life changes for ever when she discovers the laboratory's secret – a mysterious, humanoid, scaled but handsome sea creature living in a water tank and being brutally treated while studied by government scientists. She develops a unique bond with her new friend, learns its planned fate and takes drastic action to help it, which raises the suspense to the levels of a thriller. Olly Richards in Empire says, "It's a movie that will grow with repeat watches, quiet side stories getting louder with familiarity".

She then encounters an old flame and begins to regenerate. Hilary White in the Independent says, "There are one or two scenes-such as an opera-filled dinner date at a themed restaurant-that sing with precision, punch and masterful skills of observation. Lenoir sees the absurd in life but also the aching undertows. By the time the madly romantic denouement is playing out, the overall sensation is that of a celebration of the female spirit in all its beautiful, generous, chaotic, frustrating, determined and courageous wonder."

This debut autobiographical coming-of-age comedy by writer/director Gerwig is a love letter to her hometown of Sacramento and to her teenage self. To her mother's intense irritation, she will not answer to the name Christine and but only to Ladybird, (nothing to do with Lyndon Johnson's patrician wife). Peter Bradshaw in The Guardian says, "Ronan and Metcalf are tremendous in Greta Gerwig's moving and gloriously funny and wistfully autobiographical film."

This is an adaptation of the Beatrix Potter story in which a rabbit tries to outwit a farmer and save his own supply of food. Peter Rabbit and his three sisters enjoy spending time in Mr McGregor's vegetable garden. But, when a relative moves in, he is not thrilled to find a family of rabbits in his new home. A battle of wills quickly breaks out as the new owner hatches scheme after scheme to get rid of Peter and his family. But Peter proves to be a resourceful rabbit and a wily and worthy opponent. Terry Staunton in The Radio Times says, "It's solid, box-ticking, serviceable fun... there's just enough acknowledgement of the source material to keep Potter purists happy, while confidently establishing a strong enough premise for a long-running franchise on its own merits."
